

<b>Name of Tool:</b>	Driver Inventory (DI)
<b>Author/Publisher (Year)</b>	Lindeman/Behavior Data Systems Ltd. (1997)

<b>Description:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The DI is a 70-item, self-report computer scored test specifically designed for driver assessment. The Driver Inventory does not screen for alcohol or other drugs.</li> <li>• The items comprised 5 scales: (1) truthfulness scale, (2) aggressiveness scale, (3) driver risk range, (4) stress management, and (5) self-rating scale.</li> <li>• Percentile scores are used for risk classification “Low Risk,” “Moderate Risk,” “Problem Risk,” and “Severe Problem.”</li> <li>• Risk classifications, along with clinical judgement, are used to inform treatment recommendations.</li> <li>• Truthfulness Scale detects offender denial, problem minimization, and response bias.</li> <li>• Test administered requires 15 to 20 minutes and can be completed using traditional paper/pencil methods or using a computer.</li> <li>• Demonstrated reliability and validity.</li> </ul>
