Description:	<p>The DVI is a 147-item self-report actuarial assessment intended for use with persons accused or convicted of domestic violence or related offences to determine whether treatment was effective by comparing pre-test and post-test scores.</p> <p>The items comprise six scales:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Truthfulness Scale ○ Violence Scale ○ Control Scale ○ Alcohol Scale ○ Drug Scale, and ○ Stress Management <p>Scores are used to classify risk into four categories:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Low Risk ● Medium Risk ● Problem Risk and ● Severe Problem <p>These classifications, along with clinical judgment, are used to inform treatment recommendations.</p> <p>Truthfulness Scale detects probationer denial, problem minimization, and response bias.</p> <p>Demonstrated reliability and validity.</p>
Tool Development	Summary of scientific findings are available for download.
General Notes:	<p>Computerized assessment that provides clinicians with a printed report that includes percentile scores, risk classification, and item responses.</p> <p>Paper-pencil administration takes on average 30 minutes and tests are scored electronically.</p> <p>Tests can be administered individually or in group settings.</p>
