Description:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The DUI/DWI Offender Test is a 117 item self-report actuarial assessment designed for DUI/DWI offender assessment. The DDOT incorporates scale development based upon 20 years of research and evolved from the Driver Risk Inventory-2. • The items comprise 7 scales: (1) Truthfulness, (2) Alcohol, (3) Driver Risk, (4) Drug, (5) Marijuana, (6) Stress Management Scale, and (7) Substance Use Scale • Percentile scores are used for risk classification “Low Risk,” “Medium Risk,” “Problem Risk”, and “Severe Problem.” Risk classifications, along with clinical judgment, are used to inform treatment recommendations. • Test administration requires 25-30 minutes and can be completed using traditional paper/pencil methods or using a computer; individually or in groups.
