Description:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The FOI is a 122-item self-report actuarial assessment intended for first offender (male and female), non-violent assessment. • The items are spread across six scales: (1) truthfulness scale, (2) alcohol scale, (3) drugs scale, (4) antisocial scale, (5) peer pressure scale, (6) entitlement scale, and (7) self-esteem scale. • Scores are used to classify risk into four categories: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Low Risk ○ Medium Risk ○ Problem Risk and ○ Severe Problem <p>These classifications, along with clinical judgment, are used to inform treatment recommendations.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Paper-pencil administration takes on average 20 to 25 minutes and tests are scored electronically. • Test can be administered individually or in groups. • Demonstrated reliability and validity.
Tool Development	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Internal, unpublished studies provide evidence of validity, reliability and accuracy. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ 1st Offender Inventory, Scientific Findings (2014)
