Description:	<p>Designed for evaluating juveniles (14 to 18 years) The Juvenile Detention Exam (JDE) is specifically designed for juvenile (male and female) detention (detainment, confinement and incarceration).</p> <p>The JDE uses 5 scales to assess violence propensity, antisocial attitudes, and substance misuse.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Truthfulness Scale • Alcohol Scale • Drug Scale • Antisocial Scale • Violence Scale <p>Scores are used to classify risk into four categories:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Low Risk • Medium Risk • Problem Risk and • Severe Problem <p>These classifications, along with clinical judgment, are used to inform treatment recommendations.</p> <p>Truthfulness Scale detects offender denial, problem minimization, and response bias.</p> <p>Demonstrated reliability and validity.</p>

General Notes:	<p>JDE is a computerized assessment that provides clinicians with a printed report that includes percentile scores, risk classification, and item responses.</p> <p>The JDE takes 25 minutes to complete.</p> <p>Tests can be administered individually or in group settings</p>
