

<b>Name of Tool:</b>	Quick Risk Screen (QRS)

<b>Description:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The QRS is a 64 item, self-report computer scored test specifically designed to assess alcohol, drugs, truthfulness, and risk (danger to self and others).</li> <li>• The items comprised 4 scales: (1) truthfulness scale, (2) alcohol scale, (3) drug scale, and (4) risk scale.</li> <li>• Percentile scores are used for risk classification “Low Risk,” “Moderate Risk,” “Problem Risk,” and “Severe Problem.”</li> <li>• Risk classifications, along with clinical judgement, are used to inform treatment recommendations.</li> <li>• Truthfulness Scale detects offender denial, problem minimization, and response bias.</li> <li>• Test administered requires 20 minutes and can be completed using traditional paper/pencil methods or using a computer.</li> <li>• Demonstrated reliability and validity.</li> </ul>
